(a) The Contractor agrees to assign to the contract tasks those persons whose resumes were submitted with its proposal and who are necessary to fulfill the requirements of the contract as "key personnel". No substitutions may be made except in accordance with this clause.

(b) The Contractor understands that during the first ninety (90) days of the contract performance period, no personnel substitutions will be permitted unless these substitutions are unavoidable because of the incumbent's sudden illness, death or termination of employment. In any of these events, the Contractor shall promptly notify the Contracting Officer and provide the information described in paragraph (c) below. After the initial ninety (90) day period the Contractor must submit to the Contracting Officer all proposed substitutions, in writing, at least thirty (30) days in advance (sixty (60) days if security clearance must be obtained) of any proposed substitution and provide the information required by paragraph (c) below.

(c) Any request for substitution must include a detailed explanation of the circumstances necessitating the proposed substitution, a resume for the proposed substitute, and any other information requested by the Contracting Officer. Any proposed substitute must have qualifications equal to or superior to the qualifications of the incumbent. The Contracting Officer or his/her authorized representative will evaluate such requests and promptly notify the Contractor of his/her approval or disapproval thereof.

**H-3 ONR 5252.216-9706 - LEVEL OF EFFORT (DEC 88)**

(a) The Contractor agrees to provide the total level of effort specified in the next sentence in

performance of the work described in this contract. The total level of effort for performance of this contract shall be 4,840 total hours of direct labor, 6,760 total hours for Option 1, and 8,680 hours for Options 2 through 4, if exercised, including subcontractor direct labor for those subcontractors specifically identified in the Contractor's proposal as having hours included in the proposed level of effort. A breakdown of labor categories and hours is set forth in paragraph (k) below.

(b) The level of effort for this contract shall be expended at an average rate of 403 hours per month for the first 12 months, 563 hours per month for Option 1, and 723 hours per month for options 2 through 4, if exercised. It is understood and agreed that the rate of hours per month may fluctuate in pursuit of the technical objective, provided such fluctuation does not result in the use of the total hours of effort prior to the expiration of the term of the contract.

(c) The Contractor is required to notify the Contracting Officer when any of the following situations occur, or are anticipated to occur: If during any three consecutive months the monthly average is exceeded by 25% or, if at any time it is forecast that during the last three months of the contract less than 50% of the monthly average will be used during any given month; or, when 85% of the total level of effort has been expended.

(d) If, during the term of the contract, the Contractor finds it necessary to accelerate the expenditure of direct labor to such an extent that the total hours of effort specified would be used prior to the expiration of the term, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing, setting forth the acceleration required, the probable benefits which would result, and an offer to undertake the acceleration at no increase in the estimated cost or fixed fee together with an offer setting forth a proposed level of effort, cost breakdown, and proposed fixed fee for continuation of the work until expiration of the term hereof. The offer shall provide that the work proposed will be subject to the terms and conditions of this contract and any additions or changes required by then current law, regulations, or directives, and that the offer, with a written notice of acceptance by the Contracting Officer, shall constitute a binding contract. The Contractor shall not accelerate any effort until receipt of such written approval by the Contracting Officer. Any agreement to accelerate will be formalized by contract modification.

(e) The Contracting Officer may, by written order, direct the Contractor to accelerate the expenditure of direct labor such that the total hours of effort specified in paragraph (a) above would be used prior to the expiration of the term. This order shall specify the acceleration required and the resulting revised term. The Contractor shall acknowledge this order within five days of receipt.

(f) If the total level of effort specified in paragraph (a) above is not provided by the Contractor during the term of this contract, the Contracting Officer shall either (i) reduce the fixed fee of this contract as follows:

or (ii) subject to the provisions of the clause of this contract entitled "Limitation of Cost," require the Contractor to continue to perform the work until the total number of hours of direct labor specified in paragraph (a) shall have been expended, at no increase in the fixed fee of this contract.

(g) In the event the government fails to fully fund the contract in a timely manner, the term of the contract may be extended accordingly with no change to cost or fee. If the government fails to fully fund the contract, the fee will be adjusted in direct proportion to that effort which was performed.

(h) Notwithstanding any of the provisions in the above paragraphs, the Contractor may furnish hours up to five percent in excess of the total hours specified in paragraph (a) above, provided that the additional effort is furnished within the term hereof, and provided further that no increase in the estimated cost or fixed fee is required, and no adjustment in the fixed fee shall be made provided that the Contractor has delivered at least 95% of the level of effort required in paragraph (a) above.

(i) It is understood that the mix of labor categories provided by the Contractor under the contract,

as well as the distribution of effort among those categories, may vary considerably from the initial mix and distribution of effort which was estimated by the government or proposed by the Contractor.

**PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS** – Provide documentation demonstrating personnel with certification and educational background with the ability to perform the required tasks in the Statement of Work (SOW) and in accordance with the Personnel Qualifications.

**MANAGEMENT** – Provide documentation demonstrating the experience of the contractor in managing tasks like those outlined in the SOW. Provide corporate structures as related to contract, defining responsibilities, authorities and accountabilities.

### **L-13 VOLUME II - BUSINESS PROPOSAL**

REQUIRED COPIES: 1 ORIGINAL AND 3 COPIES

#### **(1) COST PROPOSAL**

The offeror shall submit a business proposal that includes a cost proposal with supporting information for each cost element consistent with offeror's cost accounting system. The supporting breakdown should include such elements as materials, direct labor, indirect cost, and other costs such as travel. The offeror shall provide exhibits as necessary to substantiate each cost element. The Government reserves the right to make award to other than the low offeror. The technical considerations are more important than the cost factor. The closer the technical scores of the various proposals are to one another, the more important the cost considerations become. The Technical and Cost factors are each more important than the Small Business Participation factor.

### M-2 EVALUATION FACTORS FOR AWARD

Proposals will be evaluated in accordance with the following criteria. The technical factor is more important than the cost factor. Technical factors 1 and 2 are twice as important as factor 3.

#### M-2-1. TECHNICAL/MANAGEMENT

- (1) **TECHNICAL UNDERSTANDING** - The offeror's technical understanding will be evaluated based upon demonstrated knowledge and understanding of each of the required task areas described in the Statement of Work.
- (2) **PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS** – The proposed personnel will be evaluated on the experience and qualifications of the proposed personnel relevant to the proposed task; the quantity and quality of the Offeror's corporate experience relevant to the proposed task; and the previous experience of the key personnel including the degree to which they meet the requirements set forth in the Personnel Qualifications.
- (3) **MANAGEMENT** – Management will be evaluated based on demonstrated capability and suitability for accomplishing the required tasks described in the Statement of Work. Corporate structure as related to contract, defining responsibilities, authorities, and accountabilities will be evaluated.

**M-2-2**      COST TO THE GOVERNMENT

Proposed estimated cost to the Government. The Government may adjust the proposed cost for purposes of evaluation based upon an evaluation of cost realism. ## STATEMENT OF WORK

### EW MODELING AND SIMULATION

#### SCOPE

The Code 5707 of the Tactical Electronic Warfare Division (TEWD) is seeking contractor assistance in a variety of disciplines related to Electronic Warfare (EW) and computer simulation applications. Code 5707 areas of interest include engineering development and computer simulation and modeling.

The contractor shall provide research and engineering services in support of three basic task areas:

- Task I - Distributed Simulation Technologies
- Task II - Electronic Warfare Analysis
- Task III - Computer Modeling and Simulation

ENEWS is tasked with developing simulations of naval EW systems, anti-ship threats, and military communication systems to support the development, fielding and testing of electronic and weapons systems. Computer simulations are highly valuable tools to research and enhance military testing and evaluation. Computer simulations facilitate relatively inexpensive and rapid force structure analysis, mission planning, test and evaluation and training. Distributed simulation - networking multiple, separate simulation components together - has become a key technology in maximizing the advantages of computer simulations, making possible the interface and interaction of a wide range of simulation components. Standardized protocols, such as Distributed Interactive Simulation (DIS), and technical advances, such as High Level Architecture (HLA), are the keys to the application of distributed simulations. Contractor support sought in this statement of work will concentrate on theoretical research, system research and development (R&D), computer modeling and simulation, and test and evaluation (T&E) relating to the interactions of platforms, weapons, sensors and EW systems. The selected contractor shall also develop and support HLA, DIS and the federation of multiple simulators to provide complex, high fidelity simulations on local computer networks as well as wide area networks (WAN). The unique nature of this research requires access to NRL hardware and classified computing resources and databases dictating that a major portion of the labor tasks be performed on-site at the Naval Research Laboratory (NRL). The Contractor shall provide, on a level-of-effort basis, the man-hours of scientific, technical, and engineering support stated in the personnel qualification.

## **1.0 TASK DESCRIPTIONS**

### **1.1 TASK I - Distributed Simulation Technologies**

The Contractor shall support the goal of federated computer EW simulation objectives through the development of methods for synchronization and coordination of initializing federated simulations across a WAN. The Contractor shall assist in the development of automated systematic methods and mechanisms for automating start and initialization of computer simulations for performing batch processes of distributed EW simulations across a WAN in order to run multiple iterations of scenarios. The contractor shall support the development of efforts to formulate a comprehensive means to facilitate federation setup and initialization and there by reduce the amount of time required to perform individual scenarios. Further the Contractor shall provide research into the handling and compartmentalizing of secure or proprietary data. The Contractor shall provide research into interoperability improvements such as automated distributed simulation coordination and synchronization across multiple sites to increase the number of simulation runs in a given period, thereby increasing productivity. The Contractor shall develop:

1. A plan to log on, access, and run classified software from a remote site on a classified network
2. Methodologies for consistent and repeatable random number generation across multiple simulations on a distributed network to support statistical analyses.
3. A process for running scenarios interactively across a WAN
4. Research in the handling and compartmentalization of secure data using the HLA Run-Time Infrastructure (RTI).
5. Development of prototype software tools as needed.

### **1.2 TASK II - ELECTRONIC WARFARE ANALYSIS**

The Contractor shall provide engineers and/or analysts to design, develop, and test ship EW defensive concepts. The Contractor shall provide analysis of EW systems, signals intelligence (SIGINT) data and weapons capabilities to develop parametric data for inclusion in computer simulations of naval systems and tactics. The Contractor shall make use of Code 5707 simulations to identify and quantify the effectiveness of ship defense system tactics. In addition, the Contractor shall provide experienced staff to support studies for quantifying the performance of network centric and single ship defense concepts.

### 1.3 TASK III - COMPUTER MODELING AND SIMULATION

The Contractor shall provide experienced engineers and computer scientists to assist in the development of high fidelity simulations that accurately represent the performance of EW systems in a complex electromagnetic environment. Areas of expertise that may be required for the programs include detailed knowledge of radar sensor systems, analog and digital circuits, missile guidance, autopilots and aerodynamics, electromagnetic propagation for ocean and littoral environments, radar cross sections (RCS) signatures, electronic attack (EA) systems, and advanced computer simulation design and development techniques. The simulations will be implemented using advanced object oriented programming techniques and capable of interoperable operation using distributed processing capabilities on state-of-the-art computer hardware. The simulations will interface with key intelligence databases that support EW parameters used in the dynamic environments. The Contractor shall also support verification and validation efforts for the simulations.

In support of Simulation Display (SIMDIS) and Builder programs, the Contractor shall provide engineers and computer scientists to assist in software enhancements for these tools. The Contractor shall provide staff with experience in C++, OpenGL, Direct3D, graphical user interfaces, cross-platform development, databases, Higher Language Architecture /Run Time Infrastructure (HLA/RTI), real-time range and operation data feeds, and telemetry systems. The Contractor shall also support the transition of these programs to various Navy and DoD activities.


